Technology Transfer: Why?

- Ensure public benefit
- Meet our obligations to sponsors
- Inventor satisfaction/motivation
- Generate revenue to support research and

research infrastructure



The Process

- Disclosure Form (<u>https://ipx.auburn.edu/resources/</u>)
- Licensing Officer (LO) assigned
- LO reviews funding, inventorship, public disclosure
- LO assesses IP protection & marketability
- Marketing
- License
- Ongoing discussions with inventor(s) at every step



Sharing the proceeds

- Per Auburn's Patent Policy*
- After IPX is reimbursed its patent expenses,

all license revenue is distributed:

- 40%: inventors
- 15%: IPX
- 45%: OSVPRED

*Different when Auburn owns or jointly owns copyrighted materials



Sharing the proceeds

- Patent Policy *recommends* OSVPRED's 45% be distributed as follows:
 - 20%: inventor(s)' lab
 - 15%: inventor(s)' department
 - 15%: inventor(s)' college
 - 50%: OSVPRED

Supporting Faculty Entrepreneurship
